Migraine Registry

Migraine is the most common recurring episodic headache in children and adolescents. Almost 1 in 10 children will develop migraine headaches.

These headaches may be cause frequent missed days from school. Migraine headache usually are disability in pediatric age group and identifying of probable triggers for appropriate prevention and control is important.

Registry of migraine can be useful for long-time preventive and therapeutic strategies.

Objectives:

- Registry of documented pediatric migraine in IRAN for diagnostic and management investigations.
- Providing appropriate treatment strategies to enhance the quality of patient's life
- Identifying the Causes of Migraine Attacks in Children.
- Observing the process of migraine changes during deferent treatment methods
- Introduce appropriate plan to improve quality of life in patients (especially educational situation)
- Monitor the patients to prevent complications

All of children and adolescents with age of less than 19 years old that their diagnosis is confirmed by pediatric neurologists.

Patients will be referred to our hospital by physicians, especially pediatric neurologist and adult neurologists. We fulfill designed questionnaire for patients, then data will be registered by experts of department of pediatric neurology research center.

Finally, all data will be analyzed by experts and results will be used for long-term strategies health program.

This registry will be done for years. But each 5 years data will be analyzed.
